

Gospel for 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time, Nov 12

Today's parable is a warning to the Christian community to remain vigilant and prepared to receive Jesus, the Son of Man who will return at the end of time. This interpretation is supported by the reference to the delay of the bridegroom. The Christian community for whom Matthew wrote this Gospel was coming to terms with the realization that the promise of Jesus' return would not be fulfilled within their lifetimes. The question remains for us to ask ourselves, 'Are we ready to receive Jesus?' Will we be prepared to receive him?

Gospel for the 33rd Sunday

Christian spirituality is not passive or inactive. Our life of prayer helps us to discern the gifts, the talents, that have been given to us. This parable teaches that God's judgment will be based on the service we render Him and to one another in accordance with those gifts. We have received them for serving. If we fail to use them, God's judgment on us will be severe. On the other hand, if we make use of these gifts in service to the Kingdom of Heaven, we will be rewarded and entrusted with even more.
